The main objective of IQAC is to maintain the quality in teaching-learning process through organizing various programmes. The following are the activities conducted by IQAC during the academic year 2019-2020.

#### **Entry Behaviour test**

In the beginning of the year, an entry behaviour test on teaching aptitude was conducted for the students to know their interest and attitude towards the teaching profession. For the M.Ed., students, Research aptitude test was conducted to know their potential in research. From the analysis of the results, the teaching–learning experiences were planned and executed.

# Project-writing for Funding Agencies & Article-writing for impact Journals

A one day faculty development programme on 'Project-writing for Funding Agencies & Article-writing for Impact Journals' was organized by IQAC of our college on 18<sup>th</sup> June 2019. Rev. Dr. V. # SPSS & AMOS utilities

A One day faculty development program on SPSS & AMOS utilities was held on 10<sup>th</sup> December 2019 which was jointly organized by Fr.Bonhoure Centre for Research and IQAC of St.Xavier's College of Education, Palayamkottai. It was formally inaugurated by Rev. Dr. G. Pushparaj, SJ, the Secretary of our college. Regression, Factor Analysis and Interpretation in SPSS & AMOS utilities are given a brief introduction and overview of structural equation modeling using the AMOS software to the participants.

# **Digital Tools for Interactive Teaching**

As the Government of India is emphasizing on MOOC through SWAYAM portal and to motivate the teacher educators to become a course designer, a three day National Level Workshop on 'Designing of Online Courses for MOOCs' was organized by IQAC of our college from 22<sup>nd</sup> June to 24<sup>th</sup> June 2020. The first two day sessions were handled by Dr. T. Asir, Assistant Professor & Head i/c, Department of Mathematics – DDE, Madurai Kamaraj University, Madurai. The first day, he discussed on 'MOOCs' and 'the SWAYAM Portal' and in the second day, the eligibility to be a course coordinator and the application form for applying to become course coordinator were explained in detail. The course design of a course in SWAYAM portal was shown to the participants. On the third day Open Shot Video Editor was dealt by Dr. M. Muthupandi, Assistant Professor, Department of Education-DDE, Madurai Kamaraj University. He demonstrated the way to edit a video and asked the participants to edit the video by themselves. The teacher educators and research scholars who participated in the workshop appreciated the college for organizing such a wonderful programme. Totally 82 participants benefitted from the programme
