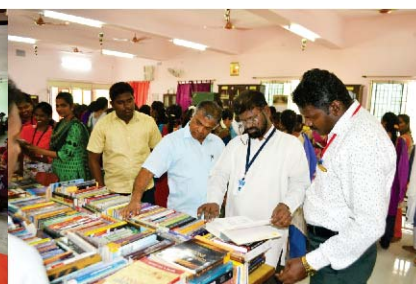

Curriculum Feedback by students

Students are the right persons to evaluate the syllabus as they are in constant touch with the syllabus. They could also evaluate the syllabus on the basis of their expectations. They can express the problems faced during the study and thus modify the syllabus according to needs and relevance. Hence curriculum feedback by the B.Ed & M.Ed students was organized in our college on 28th November 2018 in which odd Semester syllabus of B.Ed

and M.Ed were evaluated and on 5th April for even semester syllabus for both B.Ed and M.Ed were evaluated. Students' suggestions were recorded and it was promised to modify the syllabus after the approval of Board of Studies and Academic council. In this activity, all the staff members were present.

Criteria II: TEACHING LEARNING AND EVALUATION

TEACHING LEARNING

Visit to special schools

To understand the nature, needs and learning styles of special children, our college arranged for special school visits for I B.Ed Students on 28th, 29th and 30th November 2018 to schools for blind, deaf and dumb and mentally retarded respectively.

Visit to museum

In order to make the students aware of historically knowledgeable of Tamil culture, our college arranged for a visit to government museum for I B.Ed students near Tirunelveli District Police Office on 29th November 2018. The museum had variety of things like photo gallery, maps, swords, utensils and some other common goods that were used in the past, this visit enabled / widened their understanding of Tamil culture.

Visit to Science Centre

To develop a scientific attitude among students, our first year students were taken to the District Science Centre which is part of National Council of Science Museums on 30th November 2018. It was a fun-learning atmosphere; there are a number of games through which the students can learn simple concepts. The students enjoyed learning the concepts at their own pace. Some experiments on liquid nitrogen were demonstrated by Mr. Mari Lenin, Member in Science Centre which helped them acquire knowledge on science.

Special Lecture on career guidance

Eventhough our college is meant for prospective teachers, it presents the various job opportunities available in the society for our students so that they could shine in the future. Hence a one hour special lecture on 'Career guidance and How to face an Interview?' was given by

Mr. Anbuvaran, Principal of Dhanalakshmi Hr. Sec. School, Chennai on 5th January 2019. In his speech he covered the need for good Career and motivated the prospective teachers to be strong enough in their content knowledge and presentation. He also added the job opportunities available in various schools. The session was enjoyed by the whole group.

Parent teacher meet

The behavior modification of a student is possible only if we have smooth relationship with their parents. Hence our college organized parent-teacher meet on 10th January 2019 to distribute the mark statement of the odd semester examination held on November 2018. Rev. Dr. V. Henry Jerome SJ presided over the function and he appealed the parents to spend time with their wards. Rev. Dr. D. Thomas Alexander SJ explained the various activities in our college and requested the parents to look after their children's behaviour and their progress in their studies. Parents gave their feedback on the college activities. Dr. G. Pushparaj SJ interacted with the parents about the fee structure and with the approval of the parents the fee for the B.Ed students was raised to Rs.42,500 from Rs.37,500. In this meeting, 120 parents participated.

Visit to Saranalayam

To make our student teachers aware of the social evils such as child abuse, deserting the children, childhood hand begging etc., our college took them Saranalayam, a place for child welfare located at Tirunelveli on 14th September 2018. Mr. Reagan, Former Student of St. Xavier's Arts and Science College and presently field assistant in Saranalayam welcomed our students and staff. Rev. Fr. Jayabalan, Director of Saranalayam explained the evolution and mission of Saranalayam, rights of children through a video presentation. The problems faced by them in maintaining the centre was explained by Mr. Reagan. This visit made the students know the present status of the children in the society and inspired them to work for the upliftment of the children in future.

Spoken English

To be employed in matriculation or CBSE schools, the fluency in English is essential and the teachers should be a good communicator. A session was allotted in the time table for the second year B.Ed students for spoken English and they were trained oral and written communication in English.

EVALUATION

- ❖ The first Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) for Even Semester was conducted from 23rd to 27th February 2019.
- ❖ The Second CIA for Even Semester was conducted from 09th to 12th April 2019.
- ❖ Even Semester examinations was conducted from 22nd to 30th April 2019.

- ❖ Online exit behavior test and programme evaluation of even semester was conducted from 5th to 8th April 2019.
- ❖ Annual evaluation of the faculty by the students was held on 3rd April 2019.
- ❖ Staff self appraisal for this academic year and evaluation of management by staff members were done from 5th April to 8th April 2019.

Teaching aids - Internal Assessment

Teaching aids assist the teachers in their teaching and make the teaching an effective one. Hence our students are given training to prepare teachings aids for their teaching and the same was evaluated by teacher educators on 10th December 2018.

Internal evaluation of teaching competency

In order to make our B.Ed students to competent in teaching, the II B.Ed. students were sent for a four month-teaching practice. To assess their progress in teaching, internal assessments of teaching competency for optional I & optional II were held on 11th & 12th December 2018 respectively in ten groups; each group was assessed by two teacher educators and the marks were awarded for the same.

External Practical Commission

To evaluate their teaching competency in their optional I & II and record work, we had an external practical commission on 14th & 15th December 2018. A team consisting of Dr. B. Krishna Prasad, Principal, S.T. Hindu College of Education, Nagercoil, Dr. Rasul Mohaideen, Assistant Professor, V.O.C College of Education, Thoothukudi, Dr. S. Praveen Kumar, Dr. S. Devika, Assistant Professors, N.V.K.S.D. College of Education examined our students and they appreciated our students.

Interaction with administrators of internship schools

To develop a good relationship between our college and internship school, our college arranged for an interaction with the administrators of the internship schools on 18th December 2018. Rev. Dr. D. Thomas Alexander, Principal, thanked all the Headmasters and Guide teachers for their whole hearted support to complete 16 week-internship of our students in their schools. In the interaction, senior teachers from seven schools participated and expressed their views about our students' performance in the internship and gave their strengths and weaknesses. They well-appreciated the students, saying that, they had handled the classes effectively and actively involved in the school activities like conducting assembly, cultural programmes, teacher's day, children's day celebration etc... Rev. Dr. G. Pushparaj, S.J., Secretary, and the staff were present in the interaction.

Guideship

EXTENSION ACTIVITIES

Educational Tour

To have first hand experience in learning, an educational tour was arranged for first year B.Ed students to Mumbai from 27th January to 2nd February 2019. On the first day they visited Krishna Mandir, Juhu Beach, St. Mary's Cathedral, Bandra Worli Sealink and Haji Ali Dargah. Gate way of India, Taj Hotel, Chatrapathi Shivaji Museum and elphanta caves were the places visited in the second day. On the third day, vanam forest, boating and small trip around the forest were visited followed by shopping and in the evening they began their return journey.

Social project

A teacher must be aware of the social issues existing at present and must be ready to find the solution for those problems by doing research. To develop concern over the society, our II B.Ed students were divided into groups and asked to select a social issue and to construct a questionnaire to measure it. On 31st January 2019, they were asked to go to different places to collect the data. Later these data could be analysed and the findings could be published as a book.

Field Trip

Every year II B.Ed students would go for field trip so that their learning becomes the best. This year, they had gone to Kayakumari on 1st February, 2019. Vivekanandha rock, Gandhi Mandapam, eco park were visited by them and it helps them to develop their knowledge on their philosophies of life.

Visit to language laboratory

Language laboratory is a must in all colleges and it helps to develop our language skills. Our college has a well





equipped digitalized language laboratory. Hence our college language laboratory was visited by two staff members from SCAD college of Education, Cheranmahadevi on 4th February 2019 to plan for a the lab in their college.

Community Camp

To make our first year B.Ed students know the dignity and life of the people living in the villages, a three day community camp was organized in Vallavankottai from 15th-17th February 2019. On the first day tree sampling were planted in the morning, followed by the demonstration of fire safety and prevention. The second day had the free medical camp and common health awareness programme, sponsored by Alumni Association. On both the days, in the evening, we had cultural programmes by our students. On the third day, sports and fun competitions were conducted for the public followed by valediction of the camp. It was really appreciated by our students and faculty.

Criteria IV: INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

- Two hundred and twenty three new books were purchased for our college library.
- The office, classrooms, library and laboratories were furnished with 6 slotted angle rack with 5 plates, 100 file holders, 4 JK Drawer Chest, 2 BN Steel Office Table and 2 Epson EB-S41 Projector.
- Eight computer systems were purchased to equip the classrooms, laboratories and office.
- Computer laboratory is further furnished with new Computer software and WinPro 10 SNGL, 3 cordless presenter and 2 speaker boxes with 100V LMT and Amplifier.

They gave a motivational talk on 'Who am I?' and make them to identify their values by doing some fun activities.

TNTEU - Cultural and sports meet

The students those who had got prizes in the district level participated in the zonal level competitions held on 4th & 5th February 2019, organized by St. Joseph College of Education, Vaikalipatti. Our students got the overall championship in the men's section and qualified for state level sports meet. Earlier, on 28th and 29th January 2019, the district level cultural and sports meet was organised by St. Ignatius College of Education (Autonomous), Palayamkottai in which our college students participated and secured overall second place in the sports meet in the men's section.

Blood Identification Camp

Youth Red Cross of our college conducted a blood identification camp on 21st February 2019 with the support from the Judge Joseph Clinic run by the Alumni Association of St. Xavier's College, Palayamkottai. The team members including the lab assistants done a great service of taking the sample of blood from I year B.Ed., students and identified their blood groups. In addition to that, there was an extension lecture by Dr. Mohammed Ibrahim, Clinical & Surgical Oncologist, based on the theme 'What is Cancer? – Myths and beliefs', to create an awareness on cancer among the students. He shared his views about the causes, precautions and preventions to eradicate the cancer cells.

College Assembly

Among many opportunities available for our prospective teachers in the college, college assembly is yet another dais to exhibit their talents of organizing and leading; each optional group students are motivated to creatively conduct the assembly every Monday, centering on a theme of their subjects or remembrance of any common occasion. Thus we had the assemblies on 11th & 18th February, 25th March 2019. The assemblies were always interactive and informative.

Tutor ward interaction

To guide the students in their integral growth in the campus, and to maintain cordial relationship between teachers and students, the college implements tutor-ward system in which each staff member is given less than ten members for interaction and guidance. On 8th January 2019, there were tutor ward interaction for I B.Ed students to guide them in maintaining a smooth relationship among the students and teachers. This provided an opportunity

for our students to listen to their guides regarding the expectations of schools, students and college.

SEMINARS & WORKSHOPS

UGC NET Preparatory Programme

As NET is made mandatory for appointing teachers in colleges, our college in collaboration with Society for the Advancement of Library and information science (SALIS), Tirunelveli chapter organized a three day NET preparatory programme in the subjects of Education and Library Science from 30th November to 2nd December 2018. Rev. Dr. Henry Jerome SJ inaugurated the programme and Rev. Dr. D. Thomas Alexander SJ felicitated the gathering in the inaugural function. The first day was meant for NET I paper and the resource persons were Dr. A. Punitha Mary, Dr. A. Michael J. Leo, Dr. S. Sherlin, Mrs. M. Balasaraswathi, Assistant Professors of our college, Mr. M. Stephen Muthukumar, Assistant professor, St. John's College of Education, Palayamkottai and Mr. E. Kannan, Assistant Professor, M.S. Constituent College of Arts and Science, Nagalapuram. Mr. S. Lenin, Assistant Professor, M.S. University, Tirunelveli, Dr. A. Michael J Leo and Dr. S. Sherlin were the resource persons of the second day for education group. Shri. M. Manthiramoorathi, Librarian & Information Assistant (Grade II), Anna Cenetary Library, Chennai and Mr. M. Prakash, Librarian, PSG College of Technology, Coimbatore, Dr. T. Raja, our Librarian were the resource persons for the second day for library science. On the third day, Dr. A. Veliappan, Assistant Professor, M.S. University, Tirunelveli, Mrs. M. Rosary Kiruba Alexy and Dr. A. Punitha Mary, Assistant Professors of our college were the resource person for the third day for education group. Shri. J. Arumugam, Librarian, PSG College of Technology, Coimbatore and Mr. K. Ramasamy, MVM Government College of Education for women, Dindigul were the resource person for the library group. The valedictory function was presided by Rev. Dr. G. pushparaj SJ in which certificates were distributed to the participants. Dr. S. Suriyanarayanan, Advisor, SALIS delivered a special speech on this occasion. Overall, 124 PG students and Research scholars of various disciplines benefitted from this programme.

Workshop on Short Story Writing

A teacher must be an integrated personality. To develop his writing skill, on 17th December 2018, our college conducted a workshop on short story writing. Cho. Dharman, a novelist and a writer was the resource person of the day and he explained how to write the short stories and the ways to be followed to write short stories. He motivated the students to create riddles and puzzles from short stories. He concluded that creativity is more important for the teachers to write short stories.

Seminar on Media Analysis

On 13th March 2019, Our College arranged for a one day seminar on the 'Media Analysis'. The Chief Guest of the function was Rev.Fr. Kingsley, HOD, Department of Visual





Communication, St. Xavier's College of Arts and Science. Starting his sharing with chat language used in media for transforming the message, he discussed and analysed the varieties of newspapers and politics behind it. Then he analysed the creative way of producing advertisement to attract the public. Finally he concluded the session by saying that the media was the message to all, whether it is good or bad. It was well received by the students.

AWARENESS PROGRAMME

Transgender Awareness

To make our students aware of the nature and life style of transgender and to respect them, our college arranged for an awareness programme on Transgender on 29th November 2018. Thirumathi S. Viji, Founder & Director, Anbu Trust, Advocate, Thoothukudi, Thirumathi K. Malini, Professional Dancer, Bangalore and Thirumathi Chinna Pappa, Project Director, Neithal AIDS Control Society Thoothukudi were the Resource Persons. The nature, difficulties, physical and psychological characteristics, family problems social problems and legal protections of transgender were discussed in this programme.

Legal Awareness

Our college is striving to give a holistic formation to the students in all spheres of lives of the prospective teachers. To make it as a reality, Legal Awareness Programme was organized on 17th December 2018. Rev. Fr. Antony Xavier, a practicing lawyer was invited as the resource person. Fr. Antony Xavier has shared about Criminal Code Procedure which emphasizes on fair trait. He also shared about Cognizable and Non-cognizable offences where FIR plays a vital role. It helped the students learn a lot about their basic rights and encouraged them to fight for their rights.

De-addiction

Addiction to drugs is a major problem in India. Nowadays, the school children themselves are addicted to alcohol which may affect their life style in future. Hence inculcate the ill effects of addiction, the ways to get rid of it and to make the student teachers as agents for de-addiction, an awareness programme on addiction was organised on 17th December 2018. Mr. Sahayam Franco, Mr. Williams and Mrs. Vimala from Jesuit Ministry to Alcohol and Drug Dependents (JMAADD) were the resource persons. They discussed on the various issues related to addiction and the ways to rehabilitate the addicted people.

Legal rights of women

Women are to be respected and their rights to be maintained so that the society would be developed. To make aware of the rights of the women, our college in collaboration with National Commission for women conducted an awareness programme on Legal Rights of Women on 22nd January 2019. Dr. A. Mary Lenita, B.Com., M.L., Ph.D., Lecturer, Government Law College, Tirunelveli

in her Chief Guest address created an awareness of various legal rights for women through her speech and insisted that a women should possess tolerance, understanding qualities to lead a peaceful life without any chaos. Cash award for the written competition held on 11th December 2018 were distributed to those who got first, second and third as Rs. 2000/-, Rs. 1500/- and Rs. 1000/-. Six members got third prize. This programme was presided over by Rev. Dr. G. Pushparaj SJ, Secretary of our college.

Voter Awareness Forum

As we have parliamentary election in the month of May, our college organised an Voter awareness programme on 12th February 2019. Rev. Fr. M.P. Jesuraj, Pastoral Administrator, Tirunelveli Town shared his experience in election and he insisted that voting is the birth right of every citizen above the age of 18. He motivated the students by listing out the reasons for 'Why we should Vote'.

Awareness Programme on Voting Rights

The awareness programme on Voting Rights in collaboration with Rotary Club Tirunelveli Suburbs was held on 3rd April 2019. The dignitaries were introduced and welcomed by Rev. Dr. D. Thomas Alexander SJ, Principal of our college. Our secretary, Rev. Dr. G. Pushparaj SJ, in his presidential address emphasized the importance of voting and encouraged all our students to exercise their franchise without fail. Special addresses were given by Rtn. PHF. G. Vadivel, President, Rotary Club Tirunelveli Suburbs and Rtn. L. Jailani, Secretary, Rotary Club Tirunelveli Suburbs. Mr. S. Vairavaraj, Director, Trainer for Entrepreneurship, Tirunelveli clarified how to identify a good politician or a candidate. Classifying the politicians into four categories and the voters into eight categories he made us think about our position. Rtn. T.S.M.O. Hasan, Media Chairman, Rotary Club Tirunelveli Suburbs has given the awareness talk about voting rights by giving lot of statistical information about the past elections. Finally he said his work could be replaced by somebody but no one could replace his place in terms of love and passion in





work. Mr. Stalin was honoured with a shawl and gifts by the staff council. All the teaching and non teaching members were present in the function.
