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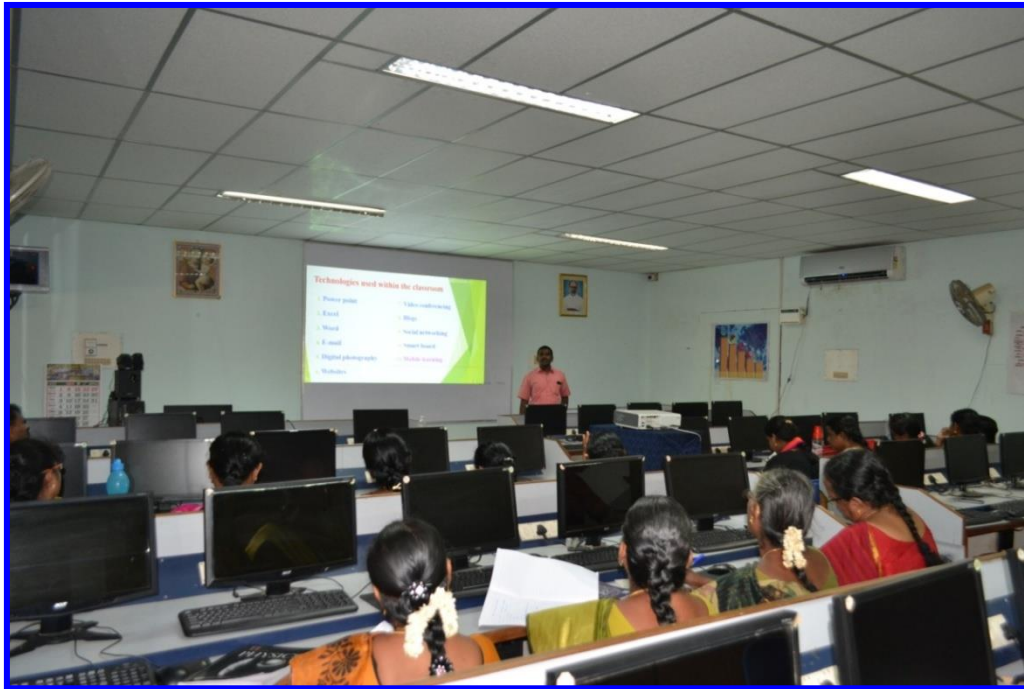

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REPORT OF THE SCIENCE EXPO 2K19

St. Xavier's College of Education organized the Zonal Level Science Expo 2K19 on 19th November 2019. The event was blessed and inaugurated by Rev. Dr. V. Henry Jerome SJ, the Rector of St. Xavier's institutions at 10.00 am in the Mother Theresa Hall. The inaugural programme began with the prayer song by the college choir, followed by Tamil Thai Valzthu. Ms. S. V. Allan Sharmila, student teacher from the department of English welcomed the gathering. Rev. Dr. D. Thomas Alexander SJ, the principal of our college shared the significance of the Science Expo in his introductory talk. Rev. Dr. G. Pushparaj SJ, the secretary presided over the inaugural function.
